SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The minutes document the meetings of church authorities from 1834 to 1859.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

A Presbyterian Church was first organized in Bono, Indiana in 1829 by Rev. W.W. Martin. However, many members moved away, and the church needed to be reorganized, which occurred on Apr. 12, 1834 by Rev. B.C. Cressy and Rev. Solomon Kittridge. Unfortunately, the earliest records of the church in 1829 were lost. The church was also called the Lawrenceport church and located in Lawrence County, Indiana.

PROVENANCE

Since Hanover College's roots are in Presbyterianism, many records throughout Indiana have been donated at various times to the Presbyterian Archives of Hanover College.

RESTRICTIONS AND PERMISSIONS

The records of the Presbyterian Archives are on deposit at Hanover College and according to the Book of Order (G-9.0406), Hanover College may only hold official records on deposit. All ownership rights to the records remain with the creators of the records (the local church), or in the case the church no longer exists, the presbytery owns the records or the successive church body.
