SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The minutes of the Jasonville church document four years of the church's meetings.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

The Jasonville Presbyterian Church was organized on May 11, 1903. The church is located in Greene County, Indiana in the southwestern part of the street.

PROVENANCE

Since Hanover College's roots are in Presbyterianism, many records throughout Indiana have been donated at various times to the Presbyterian Archives of Hanover College.

RESTRICTIONS AND PERMISSIONS

The records of the Presbyterian Archives are on deposit at Hanover College and according to the Book of Order (G-9.0406), Hanover College may only hold official records on deposit. All ownership rights to the records remain with the creators of the records (the local church), or in the case the church no longer exists, the presbytery owns the records or the successive church body.
