SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The collection contains session minute books and a church register of membership and officers.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

The New Washington church is located in Clark county, Indiana in the in the southeastern portion of the state along the Ohio River.

PROVENANCE

Since Hanover College's roots are in Presbyterianism, many records throughout Indiana have been donated at various times to the Presbyterian Archives of Hanover College.

RESTRICTIONS AND PERMISSIONS

The records of the Presbyterian Archives are on deposit at Hanover College and according to the Book of Order (G-9.0406), Hanover College may only hold official records on deposit. All ownership rights to the records remain with the creators of the records (the local church), or in the case the church no longer exists, the presbytery owns the records or the successive church body.
