## **SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT**

The collection contains the minutes and a pamphlet of an address given to the society. The purpose of the society was “investigating religious truth and inquiry into the present state of the church and the world.”

## **PROVENANCE**

The society began in 1848 and it is unclear when it officially ended. There is no official record dating when the minute book was donated to the library. It is likely a part of the school’s early student records books.
