SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The memoir of William McKee Dunn (1814-1887) was written by William Wesley Woollen and published privately by the Knickerbocker Press of G. P. Putnam's Sons of New York, New York.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

William McKee Dunn was born December 12, 1814 in Hanover, Indiana, the fifth child of Williamson Dunn and Miriam Wilson Dunn. Wm. Dunn attended Hanover College and graduated in 1842. He had a distinguished career as the Judge advocate general of the U.S. Army, delegate to the Indiana constitutional convention of 1850, and as Commanding Brigadier General for the U.S. Volunteers of the Civil War.

Dunn served as a member of the Hanover College board of trustees for twenty years. He died on July 24, 1887. (Biographical information was taken from Frank S.
