The boarding house agreement is a signed document between four men and the Hanover College board of trustees regarding the terms for renting of the house for students and a promise that no alcohol will be sold on the building premises. This is the earliest known student housing document for Hanover College.

Richard C. Talbott, Nathaniel Bayless, James C. Graham, and Elmer Gale entered into an agreement with the Hanover College Board of Trustees to help manage the use, rent, and leasing of a boarding house. Mentioned in the agreement is that there will be no sale of “spirits” (alcohol) on the premises of the boarding house.
