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SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

U.S. Senator William Jenner's papers are organized into five series of records containing the following types of materials: political and business speeches, Senate committee files and legislative bills, legal files, correspondence, radio and television broadcast speeches, an oral history typescript, political correspondence, newspaper clippings, government reference books, photographs, sound records, TV film, pictures, political cartoons, campaign buttons, souvenirs, and gift plaques.

The strength of the Jenner collection is his speeches and correspondence, which focus on national and international issues of the late 1940s and the 1950s. Jenner's political life in the U.S. Senate focused on the topics of communism, the Korean War, the New Deal, the Fair Deal, the Supreme Court, foreign policy, and the problems of the Truman administration. He was a member of the Internal Security Committee that investigated communist influences within the United States and was a key player in the period known as McCarthyism. His correspondence, Senate committee files, and legislation document his work as a senator and his relations with constituents and fellow politicians in government. A jewel of the Jenner papers is his collection of autographed photographs given to him by over 110 fellow senators, who served between 1947 and 1958.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

William Ezra Jenner was born in Marengo, Crawford County, Indiana on July 21, 1908. He graduated from Indiana University at Bloomington in 1930 and received his law degree and passed the bar that year. He began his law practice at Paoli, Indiana in 1932 and served as a Republican member of the Indiana state senate from 1934 to 1942. He was the minority leader of the senate from 1937 to 1939 and majority leader from 1939 to 1941. He resigned his seat in the senate in 1942 so that he could serve in the Second World War. Jenner served overseas and retired as a captain in the Army Air Corps in 1944.

Upon the death of U.S. Senator Frederick Van Nuys of Indiana, Jenner was appointed to fill the Senate seat vacated by Van Nuys. In this capacity Jenner served as a U.S. Senator from November 14, 1944 to January 3, 1945. He was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1946 and served two terms from January 3, 1947 to January 3, 1959. As a Republican senator for Indiana he participated in several senatorial committees in Washington including: co-chairman of the Joint Committee on Printing; chairman of the Committee on Rules and Administration, and member of the Internal Security Committee. Upon completion of his service in the U.S. Senate, Jenner resumed his law practice in Indiana. He died in Bedford, Indiana on March 9, 1985. ("Biographical Directory of the United State Congress."

HINTS IN USING THIS FINDING AID EFFECTIVELY

Finding Materials within the Collection

The finding aid lists the location of materials by box number, folder number within that box, and item number within that folder. These three location numbers are needed to retrieve collection materials. After viewing items in the collection, the documents should be returned carefully to their original box location.

How to Use the Index

There are three indexes of the Jenner papers. First, the subject index covers topics found in the collection and the names of groups to which Jenner spoke. The person index lists the names of individuals who are main subjects, correspondents, or politicians in photographs not included in the senators index. The U.S. Senators photograph index includes only those senators who donated an autographed photo to Jenner.

Understanding the Index Citations

The citations in the index include numbers that indicate the box, folder, and item location within the collection.

For example, information on Joseph McCarthy as shown below would be found in Box 48, Folder 6, and in Items 5 and 6. If the entire folder were on McCarthy, the citation would read 48:6, or just 48 if McCarthy were the subject of the whole box. Colons designate the separation between box, folder, and item. Commas illustrate a continuation of materials in the same location field.

SERIES 1 SPEECHES, 1940-1958

The series is comprised of political speeches given by Jenner on the floor of the U.S. Senate, at campaign locations throughout Indiana, and as an invited guest to various groups in Illinois, Kentucky, the Midwest, Washington D.C., and throughout the country. Speeches focus on the subjects of foreign policy, the Marshall Plan, Communism, Lincoln Day, business, trade, agriculture, patriotism, community affairs, and bills of the Senate.

The political speeches follow a chronological order from box 1-7 and include some miscellaneous and unused speeches in boxes 7 and 8. The speeches begin with Jenner's local Indiana and state senate political work and then continue with the majority of his addresses as a U.S. Senator.
