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SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The John Finley Crowe Family Collection contains diaries, histories, correspondence, financial books, land deeds, lecture books, class notes, microfilm, family photos, artifacts, and one microfilm. The collection includes documents regarding the early history of Hanover Academy and Hanover College by John Finley Crowe and Joshua B. Garritt. Sermons, diaries, and histories document the ministry and educational experiences of Crowe. The majority of the collection is the general correspondence of John Finley Crowe and the correspondence of the Crowe family. Of special importance in the papers of Crowe's children are the Civil War diaries of Colonel Samuel Stanhope Crowe. These writings document his experiences as a military leader in the 93rd Indiana Volunteer Infantry from 1861-1864.

The first two series of the collection are the papers of John Finley Crowe and his wife Esther Alexander Crowe. The last series, which comprises about half the size of the collection, contains the correspondence, photos, and papers of their children and other descendants. This series is divided into the papers of each child from eldest to youngest. The papers of spouses, including Joshua B. Garritt (spouse of Sarah Crowe), grandchildren, or great-grandchildren are grouped with the papers of the child of John Finley Crowe to whom they are directly related. A genealogy chart of descendants of John Finley and Esther Alexander Crowe is in Box 8 Fd. 8 Item 2.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

John Finley Crowe was born June 16, 1787 in Green County, Tennessee to Benjamin Crowe and Ann Gregg. In 1802, the Crowe family moved to Bellevue, Missouri. Due to the preaching of Robert Stevenson, a Presbyterian minister, John Finley felt the call to become a minister. Subsequently, he moved to Danville, Kentucky in 1809 and spent two years in private study before entering Transylvania University at Lexington during the winter quarter of 1811-12. He graduated in 1813 at age twenty-six. During his studies Crowe met Dr. James Blythe, who later became the first president of Hanover College. Dr. Blythe attempted to persuade Crowe to attend the new seminary in Princeton, New Jersey, but Crowe postponed Princeton for marriage.

At the close of 1813 John Finley Crowe married Esther Alexander on Nov. 23 in Bellevue, Missouri. Esther Alexander was born June 8, 1792 in Green County, Tennessee. The John Finley Crowe family would eventually include twelve children. In 1814 Crowe was sent as a commissioner to the meeting of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia. For the next two years he studied at the Princeton Theological Seminary and was ordained a Presbyterian minister in 1815. His first responsibility was at the Academy at Shelbyville, Kentucky where he also was pastor of the Fox Run and Bullskin churches.

While in Shelbyville Crowe attempted to further the spiritual education of blacks, which was opposed by the community. Further, for one year he wrote a newspaper beginning on May 7, 1822 entitled *Abolition Intelligence and Missionary Magazine*. Due to

Crowe's anti-slavery view, he was rejected in Shelbyville and so he accepted a position in 1823 to be a pastor for the Hanover, Indiana church.

As pastor of the Hanover Presbyterian Church, Crowe spent the next several years proposing that a ministerial school be started in Hanover. In 1825 he received approval by the Presbytery, but he was unable to find a teacher. On January 1, 1827 Crowe started the Hanover Academy and served as both teacher and principal, which earned him the recognition of being the founder of the college. Two students met in the small log cabin on the first day of school, but the number gradually increased. Hanover Academy was incorporated by the Indiana legislature on Jan. 6, 1829. On May 8, 1832 Dr. James Blythe was named president of the Academy, and Dr. Crowe served as vice-president. On Jan. 1, 1833 the school received its charter to become Hanover College.

Crowe worked hard to gain financial support for the college, traveling to the East to solicit money, but the first few years of Hanover were insecure. In order to improve the financial stability of the school Pres. Erasmus D. MacMaster, the third president of Hanover College, moved the college to Madison, IN to start Madison University in Dec. 1843. Fortunately, the Madison school was not successful, and Hanover College returned in March 1844.

John Finley Crowe served as a member of Hanover College's Board of Trustees from 1832-60 and as president of the board from 1844-57. He held a position on the faculty from 1827-59. He taught logic, history, political economics, and other subjects. In 1857 he retired though he occasionally taught for the college. Crowe died on Jan. 17, 1860 at age seventy-two. (Adapted from *History of Hanover College from 1827 to 1927* by William Millis and Frank S. Baker's *Glimpses of Hanover's Past*.)

PROVENANCE

The John Finley Crowe Family Collection has been in the Hanover College archives for many years. Not all of the donations to the collection have been documented, but the majority of the collection was given by several of the descendants of John Finley Crowe.

The majority of the collection, including typescripts of letters, was given by Sadie Gilchrist Allison, a great-granddaughter of John Finley Crowe. Mrs. Allison obtained the materials from her mother Margaret Garritt Gilchrist who was the daughter of Joshua B. Garritt and Sarah Crowe Garritt. Mrs. Allison also donated the Garritt family photo album and the John Finley Crowe artifacts. She gave these materials to Hanover College on June 3, 1967.

The Civil War diaries of Colonel Samuel S. Crowe, son of John Finley and Esther Crowe, were donated by Harold E. Crowe in February 1979.

In 1971 Lawrence E. Crowe donated the photos of the family of Benjamin W. Crowe and Benjamin Crowe's wedding license.

The microfilm copy of John Finley Crowe's account book fragments (MS E19 and MS P564) are courtesy of the Department of Special Collections, Kenneth Spencer Research Library, University of Kansas, Lawrence, KS 66045.

RESTRICTIONS AND PERMISSIONS

The John Finley Crowe Family Collection is open for research. Due to the fragility of original letters and diaries, the original materials are restricted. Photocopies and transcripts are available and should be used first. Permission to use the originals should be obtained by the archivist in charge of the reading room. If the term "Access Restricted" is used in this finding aid, it means the documents are too fragile to be handled at all.

The microfilm copy of Crowe's account book fragments, which includes the list of the earliest students of Hanover Academy, is owned by the University of Kansas and is in this collection with their permission. They have placed the following restriction on the microfilm's contents: "beyond fair use, permission must be obtained for copying and/or publication and users of the microfilm must direct such requests to the Department of Special Collections, Kenneth Spencer Research Library, University of Kansas, Lawrence, KS 66045."

There are three photocopied letters from John Finley Crowe to George Dunn and George Monson in this collection. The originals are held in the Dunn Mss., Manuscripts Dept., Lilly Library, Indiana U., Bloomington, IN. Permission was received to copy these letters for the Crowe collection, but permission to use these materials beyond fair use must be obtained by Indiana University.

Materials from the collection may be copied based on the policies and costs determined by the archives. Preference will be given to copying from copies already in the collection and not the original, fragile documents.

Permission to publish whole documents from the collection, or publication of these materials on the Internet, or any electronic environment, requires a written proposal approved by the archivist of Hanover College.

COPYRIGHT, PUBLIC DOMAIN, AND FAIR USE

The unpublished materials of John Finley Crowe in this collection will become public domain on January 1, 2003 based on the Sunny Bono Copyright Extension Act. The unpublished writings of other family members will be affected differently by the act. Please read the archives' policy on copyright and fair use, which can be obtained by the archivist in charge of the reading room, to have a better understanding of the copyright of these materials.

SEPARATION STATEMENT

John Finley Crowe's cane, which was donated by Sadie Gilchrist Allison, has not been included in the collection due to the size of the item. The cane is held in the Hanover College archives vault and may be seen upon request.

HINTS IN USING THIS FINDING AID EFFECTIVELY

Manuscript Location

The location of a manuscript listed in the finding aid is described by box number, folder number within that box, and item number within the folder. These three location numbers are needed to retrieve a manuscript. Please return the documents carefully to their specific location and order. To help maintain order, photocopies have the folder and item number (i.e. [3:1]) written in pencil in the top right hand corner of the page.

Repetitious Blank Spaces in Sermons and Correspondence

In lists of correspondence or sermons in the finding aid, blank spaces for date, author, or writer's location indicate a continuation of the date, author, or writer's location listed above. Example:

The location of Lexington, KY applies to all subsequent items until another location is specified. This also applies to the dates in items three and five.

Dual Authored Letters

Occasionally two Crowe family members will have written a joint letter. The original letter is located with the correspondence of the first writer. A photocopy is located with the correspondence of the secondary writer. The list of the secondary writer's correspondence in the finding aid contains a cross reference to the original joint letter.

How to Use the Index

There are three indexes of the Crowe family papers. First, the subject index covers topics found in the collection. The person index lists the names of individuals who are main subjects and correspondents. The photograph index includes photos of members and descendants of the John Finley Crowe family and a photo album of the Garritt family.

Understanding the Index Citations

The citations in the index include numbers that indicate the box, folder, and item location within the collection.

For example, information on Joshua Garritt as shown below would be found in Box 12, Folder 5, and in Items 26 and 29. If the entire folder were on Garritt, the citation would read 12:5, or just 12 if Garritt were the subject of the whole box. Colons designate the separation between box, folder, and item. Commas illustrate a continuation of materials in the same location field.

**SERIES 1: JOHN FINLEY CROWE HISTORICAL WRITINGS, SERMONS,
AND LECTURE NOTES, 1812-1951**

The series begins with the histories written by Crowe about his family, his early years, and Hanover College. Several diaries, financial documents, and land deeds document Crowe's years as a pastor in Kentucky and in Indiana and as founder of Hanover College. Crowe's class notes from his studies at Transylvania University from 1811-1813 are included. A collection of Crowe's written sermons during his ministry are listed with their date, the scriptural citation, and a line of the scripture. Some of Crowe's lectures as a professor at Hanover College are within the series. A microfilm copy of documents owned by the University of Kansas contains fragments of Crowe's early diaries with Hanover College records that list the first students of the academy during the early years of the school.

A history and genealogy of the Crowe family beginning with John Finley's great-grandfather and following down to the children in the Benjamin Crowe family. John Finley writes about his siblings' families and describes their disbursement throughout the United States. He mentions the family history of his wife's parents and their children.

Early memories in Green Co. Tennessee of Indian troubles in the 1790s are recounted as well as the Crowe family's move to Missouri. John Finley mentions getting an illness at age thirteen, which led him to reading and an education. He describes attending Methodist meetings and some of his earliest spiritual feelings about religion. He explains his conversion to Presbyterianism and recounts his educational experiences in Kentucky, the General Assembly meeting in Philadelphia in 1814, and his studies at

Princeton Theological Seminary. After being ordained to the ministry, he describes his work as pastor in Shelbyville, Kentucky. The memoir ends when Crowe mentions that he plans to write a newspaper entitled "Abolition Intelligence," in 1822.

Known as the "Old Crowe Manuscript," Crowe's history of Hanover College traces the beginnings of Presbyterianism in Indiana as it relates to the college. Crowe discusses the founding of Hanover Academy, and the administrations of Presidents Blythe, McAuley, and MacMaster. The issue of Hanover College becoming Madison University and the reestablishment of the school at Hanover are detailed. The history appears to end in 1844, though the second half of the history gives information from the Board of Trustees minutes, and executive correspondence of Hanover College throughout the 1840s. Crowe gives brief descriptions throughout the diary of his travels as a preacher in Indiana and Kentucky in 1818-1820 and throughout the 1820s. The middle portion of the diary contains financial data for the church, and statistics from the 1824 General Assembly meeting in Philadelphia. There are several pages that contain the dates and topics of Crowe's sermons. The last four pages record Crowe's journey to New York City in 1830 and his expenses there.

An account of contributions to the Theological Seminary of Hanover is at the beginning of the book and is followed by Crowe's record of financial dealings with other people. The second half of the book contains Crowe's financial data with the Assembly Board of Education.

The book is written from both ends. The first half includes a membership list of the Hanover Presbyterian Church on June 15, 1840 and a few additions in 1841. Names of Hanover students in Crowe's political economy class are mentioned as well as the text of a Crowe sermon written in pencil. The second side of the book is a fifteen page diary account entitled "Remarks on the weather of Texas in the winter of 1839 and 1840.

The first pages include an attendance list for Crowe's Political Economy and Logic summer 1849 classes. The middle part of the book contains lists of questions from Crowe's history lessons in Feb. and Mar. 1854. Crowe also wrote out articles approved by the Board of Trustees regarding issues at Hanover College. The Reed, Finley, and Sturgis scholarships are mentioned.

He mentions being asked to go study at Princeton.

Crowe relates his experiences while studying at Princeton and shares his fears for Esther's health during her pregnancy. The Oct. 21st letter contains Crowe's feelings after learning his wife had given birth. A description of their newborn son is given in the Jan. 14, 1815 letter. Crowe planned to return to Esther by late spring 1815. His previous letters discuss his desire to visit his wife, and he mentions their financial difficulties. The Nov. 18, 1817 letter has a description of Crowe's journeys while preaching in Illinois.

The typescript contains information from the previous listed journals and journals not in the collection. Harold E. Crowe made a transcription from an earlier 1894 transcription made by his father, John F. Crowe, who is the “Johnnie” mentioned in Col. Crowe’s diary.

The diary entries begin when Samuel S. Crowe is the Captain of Company B in the 93rd Indiana Volunteer Infantry and his troops have just left Memphis, Tennessee. He gives an account on Apr. 17, 1863 of Union army ships running a blockade and the sinking of the Henry Clay (p. 51). He fought on May 14 and took Jackson, Mississippi (p. 67-68). The following pages describe Crowe’s involvement in the Battle of Vicksburg (p. 70-96). On June 5 Samuel Crowe is recommended to become a major (p. 83). In mid-July 1863 Crowe recounts skirmishes in retaking Jackson, MS (p. 103-05). Crowe mentions his 44th birthday on July 23, 1863, and on the next day he describes General Sherman arresting a major, lieutenant, and soldier for planning to burn a cotton gin (p.108). From July 31 to Sept. 1, Samuel Crowe gets to return home for the summer (p. 111-21). He suffers from a disease called the “piles” from Sept. 23 to Nov. 1. Crowe spends much of his time recovering in a hospital at Vicksburg. He receives his commission as a major on Oct. 2 (p. 130). He is sworn in as a major on Oct. 29 (p.142) and returns to his regiment on Nov. 3. Until Jan. 4, 1864 when the account ends abruptly, it appears Crowe and his soldiers are in Mississippi but Crowe hasn’t encountered any fighting since recovering from his sickness.
