SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The collection consists of essays and speeches written by Crawford for school assignments and presented before the Philalethean Literary Society and the Society of Religious Inquiry.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Henry Ellet Crawford was born in Orange Co., North Carolina on Dec. 1, 1838. He graduated from Hanover College with a B.A. in 1859 and an A.M. in 1867. He studied at Princeton Theological Seminary from 1859-1862. He was ordained a minister on Oct. 10, 1863. He served from 1862-63 at Pleasant and Jefferson, Indiana and also served as pastor there from 1863 until 1865. He died on Feb. 5, 1866 in Pleasant, IN.
