SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The collection contains Parker's college diplomas from Park College, McCormick Theological Seminary, the University of Chicago, and Wabash College.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Albert George Parker, Jr. was born in Highland Maryland on September 6, 1891. He earned a B.A. from Park College in 1914, a Bachelor of Divinity degree from McCormick Theological Seminary in 1919 and Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. He was ordained to the ministry in 1917. He served head of the department of Social Science of Shantung Christian University in China from 1921 to 1928. He also worked as the director of famine relief for North China. Parker was the 12th president of Hanover College from 1928 to 1958. He died in Hanover, Indiana on March 22, 1958 (Frank S. Baker's *Glimpses of Hanover's Past: 1827-1977*).
