SCOPE AND CONTENT STATEMENT

The collection contains the minutes of the Wabash Indiana Presbytery from 1831 to 1858.

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Some historical writings say Wabash Presbytery was formed from the east section of the Salem Presbytery in 1825 and joined the Synod of Indiana in 1826. (Frank S. Baker's *The Hanover Presbyterian Church: 1820-1970*, p. 62.) The minute book in this collection claims that Wabash Presbytery was created on Oct. 14, 1831 from the Indiana Presbytery in the Green River Synod. The presbytery existed until about 1870 when boundaries and names changed for presbyteries in Indiana, and the Wabash Presbytery was divided into the Fort Wayne and Muncie Presbyteries. This presbytery should not be confused with the two later presbyteries named Wabash River and Wabash Valley. PROVENANCE

Since Hanover College's roots are in Presbyterianism, many records throughout Indiana have been donated at various times to the Presbyterian Archives of Hanover College.
